Information for Parent/Guardian:

California law provides that after a student has been lawfully admitted to a kindergarten and has attended for a year, the student shall be promoted to the first grade unless the school district and the student's parent/guardian agree to the student's continuance to attend kindergarten for not longer than one additional year. This rule applies whether a student begins kindergarten at the beginning of a school year or at some later date, so that a student who begins kindergarten in January, for example, shall be promoted the following January unless there is a formal agreement to have the student continue in kindergarten. Because kindergarten-age students often do not develop at steady or predictable rates, the California Department of Education recommends that approval for a student to continue not be given until <u>near the anniversary</u> of a student's admittance to kindergarten.
